

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Definition. The term "public place" as used in this Chapter shall mean any street, alley, park, public building, any place of business or assembly open to or frequented by the public, and any other place which is open to the public view, or to which the public has access.

5.2 Acts Prohibited. No person shall:

- (1) Commit an assault, or an assault and battery of any person;
- (2) Be intoxicated in a public place and either endangering directly the safety of another person or a property or acting in a manner that causes a public disturbance;
- (3) Be present in any public place with his ability to walk, talk, or see significantly impaired by the use of any controlled substance as defined by sections 7212 to 7220 of the Michigan Public Health Code (Article 7), as amended, provided, however, that this subsection shall not be construed to apply to a person whose faculties have been impaired by medication prescribed by a physician and taken as directed;
- (4) Discharge any firearm, air rifle, air pistol or bow and arrow in the Village, except when in connection with a regularly scheduled educational or training program under adequate supervision;
- (5) Fire, discharge, display, or possess any fireworks except of the type and under the Conditions permitted by Chapter 39 of the Penal Code of the State of Michigan, as last amended by Act 422 of the Public Acts of 1980;
- (6) Engage in peeping in the windows of any inhabited place;
- (7) Beg in any public place;
- (8) Swim or bathe in any public place without wearing proper apparel;
- (9) Utter vile, profane or obscene language in any public place;
- (10) Engage in fortune telling or pretend to tell fortunes for hire, gain, or reward;
- (11) Engage in any indecent, insulting, immoral, or obscene conduct in any public place;
- (12) Make any immoral exhibition or indecent exposure of his or her person;
- (13) Print, engrave, sell, offer for sale, give away, exhibit or publish, or have in his possession for any such purpose, any obscene, lewd, lascivious, indecent or immodest book, pamphlet, paper, picture, cast statuary, image or representation or other article of an indecent or immoral nature, or any book, paper, print, circular or writing made up principally of pictures or stories of immodest deeds, lust, or crime, or exhibit any such article within the view of any passerby;
- (14) Improperly, lewdly or wrongfully accost, ogle, insult, annoy, follow, pursue, lay hands on, or by any gesture, any public place or public vehicle;
- (15) Engage in any disturbance, fight, or quarrel in a public place;
- (16) Collect or stand in crowds, or arrange, encourage, or abet the collection of persons in crowds for illegal or mischievous purposes in any public place;
- (17) Jostle or roughly crowd persons in any street, alley, park or public building;

- (18) Loiter on any street or sidewalk or in any park or public building or conduct himself in any public place so as to obstruct the free and uninterrupted passage of the public;
- (19) Play any ball game in any public street or sidewalk or otherwise obstruct traffic on any street or sidewalk by collecting in groups thereon, for any purpose;
- (20) Engage in any act of prostitution;
- (21) Attend, frequent, operate or be an occupant or inmate of any place where prostitution, gambling, the illegal sale of intoxicating liquor, or where any other illegal or immoral business or occupation is permitted or conducted;
- (22) Engage in prostitution, gambling, the illegal sale of intoxicating liquor, or any other illegal or immoral business or occupation. Proof of recent reputation for engaging in prostitution, gambling, illegal sale of intoxicating liquor, or other illegal or immoral occupation or business shall be prima-facie evidence of being engaged or occupied therein;
- (23) Solicit or accost any person for the purpose of inducing the commission of any illegal or immoral act;
- (24) Knowingly transport any person to a place where prostitution or gambling is practiced, encouraged, or allowed for the purpose of enabling such person to engage in gambling or in any illegal or immoral act;
- (25) Keep or maintain a gaming room, gaming tables, or any policy or pool tickets, used for gaming; or knowingly suffer a gaming room, gaming tables, or any policy or pool tickets to be kept, maintained, played or sold on any premises occupied or controlled by him;
- (26) Disturb the public peace and quiet by loud, boisterous, or vulgar conduct;
- (27) Permit or suffer any place occupied or controlled by him to be a resort of noisy, boisterous, or disorderly persons;
- (28) Obstruct, resist, hinder, or oppose any member of the police force, or any peace officer in the discharge of his duties as such;
- (29) Wander about the streets, either by day or night, or loiter in any public building, without any lawful means of support or without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself;
- (30) Prowl about any alley or the private premises of any person in the nighttime, without authority or the permission of the owner of such premises;
- (31) Spit on any sidewalk, or on the floor or place of public assemblage;
- (32) Wrongfully throw or propel any snowball, missile or object toward any moving automobile;
- (33) Wrongfully throw or propel any snowball, missile or object toward any person or automobile;
- (34) Neglect or fail to support his wife children or family, if he shall have sufficient ability to do so, or leave or desert his wife, children or family without sufficient means of support.
- ~~(35) Vend, sell or distribute in any manner whatsoever, any article or medicinal preparation primarily manufactured for, or which may be used as, a contraceptive except sales or distributions by or to any licensed medical practitioner or registered pharmacist (Struck from code 9/10/02)~~

- (36) Willfully destroy, remove, damage, alter or in any manner deface any property not his own, or any public school building, or any public building, bridge, fire hydrant, alarm box, street lights, street sign, traffic control device, railroad sign or signal, parking meter, or shade tree belonging to the Village or located in the public places of the Village, or mark or post handbills on, or in any manner mar the walls of, any public building, or fence, tree, or pole within the Village, or destroy, take, or meddle with any property belonging to the Village, or remove the same from the building or place where it may be kept, placed, or stored, without proper authority;
- (37) Summon, as a joke or prank or otherwise without any good reason therefore, by telephone or otherwise, the Police or the Fire Department of any public or private ambulance to go to any address where the service called for is not needed;
- (38) Go upon the lands of another or upon the right of way of any railroad company, or climb, stand in or upon any tree for the purpose of witnessing or looking at any football game, baseball game or other athletic sports or games whatsoever, or any fair, show or other entertainment whatsoever, without the consent and permission of the owner or occupant of such lands, right of way or the owner of any such tree;
- (39) Make an improper noise, disturbance or riot, or engage in any illegal or improper diversion, or aid or abet the commission of such acts, or encourage or promote the commission of such acts.
- (40) Be intoxicated in a public place;
- (41) Consume alcoholic liquor in any public place except in a business licensed to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises; nor shall a person who owns, operates or controls any such public establishment or store permit the consumption of alcoholic liquor therein;
- (42) Sound any horn or signal device on any automobile, motorcycle, bus or other vehicle except as a danger signal; or create by means of any signal device an unreasonably loud or harsh sound; or sound a horn or signal device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time;
- (43) Play any radio, television set, phonograph or any musical instrument in such a manner or with such volume, particularly during the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or at any other time and in any place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any dwelling, office, hotel or other type of residence or of any persons in the vicinity;
- (44) Yell, shout, hoot, whistle, sing or make any other loud noise in any public place between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. or make any such noise at anytime so as to disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any public place or in any dwelling, hotel or type of residence or of any persons in the vicinity.
