

VILLAGE OF WALDRON  
TRUTH & TAXATION HEARING  
COUNCIL MEETING

JUNE 11, 2002

The Village of Waldron held a Truth & Taxation Hearing June 11<sup>th</sup> 2002 at 6:45 P.M. with eleven from the public present.

President Terry Rossi called the meeting to order by asking every one to join him in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call of Councilors was asked for: Present were John Burress, Chris Crist, Harold Douglas, Marlowe Eidenier, Roy Hall, Charles E Meade, And President Terry Rossi.

The Truth & Taxation notice was read by President Rossi.

Contents being: Due to the Headley roll back the mileage would go back to 11.1585 mills and generate \$62,216.00. With the Truth and Taxation hearing it would be brought back up to 11.5160 mills, still being less than last years mills of 11.6641. With the hearing it will generate another \$1993.00 bring the total up to \$64,209. The increase from the roll back is 3.20%. Without the hearing the increase would be 1.71%.

President Rossi asked for comments from the public, hearing none he adjourned the Truth & Taxation hearing at 6:50 P.M. to go into the monthly council meeting at 7:00P.M.

President Rossi called the monthly council meeting to order at 7:00P.M. with all councilors being present.

Douglas moved to set the mileage for the year 2002 at 11.5160 mills. Supported by Eidenier—Motion carried unanimously.

Noted that the fire dept will be purchasing a washing machine for the Department use.

Douglas moved to send a letter of disapproval to the Hillsdale County Road Commission in the possibility of closing the public access to Mallory Lake in which several from the area fish in. Supported by Eidenier—Motion carried

Rules of Procedure was set aside for as to get the Attorney's opinion of the rules.

There was discussion on asking the property owner at 125 N. Main St. to put up a fence to block view from the road of the disabled vehicles on his property.

Hall moved a motion that a fence not to be put up to hide the disabled vehicles at 125 N. Main St., but rather to get rid of the them. Motion failed due to lack of support.

Burress moved that the property owner at 125 N. Main St. to put up a fence and a gate along the west end of his property to hide the vehicles on his property and to provide easy access within thirty days of notification and to remove the vehicles from within six months of said notice. Supported by Douglas—Motion carried

There was a question on no u-turn signs, stating that if we are not going to in-force them, they should be taken down. This will be checked on.

President Rossi stated, that he would like complaints pertaining to the ordinances to please be put in writing.

Various reports were verbally presented: Police, Maintenance, Sanitary/lagoon repair, and Water Inspections of cross connections.

Meade moved to raise the wages per hour to ten dollars for Maintenance Thomas E Brown and Clerk Richard Andrews. They are presently at \$9.50 & \$9.28 per hour respectively. Supported by Eidenier—Roll call vote: Burress no; Crist yes; Douglas no; Eidenier yes; Hall no; Meade yes; Pres. Rossi yes: Four yes & three no—Motion carried

Burress moved to approve the May 14<sup>th</sup> 2002 minuets and reports that were presented. Supported by Crist—Motion carried

Meade moved to pay the bills from the respective funds. Supported by Eidenier—Motion carried

The disposal of the property at 101 Church was set aside till next July 9<sup>th</sup> 2002 meeting.

Meade moved to accept the high sealed bid for the 1985 pickup, which was opened at this public meeting by President Rossi from Boyd Sommerlott at the cost of \$685.00. Supported by Douglas: Roll call vote: Burress yes; Douglas yes; Crist yes; Eidenier yes; Hall yes; Meade yes; President Rossi yes: Motion carried unanimously.

Burress move a motion to approve of Myrl Meller to remodel the porch on the south side of house at 131 S. Main St. and meeting all codes required by the Hillsdale County Inspectors Office. Supported by Crist—Motion carried

Crist moved to engage feller, Finch & Associates of Toledo OH to work up a Preliminary bid for a Water Grant Application, which will be at the cost of \$3,000.00. Supported by Meade—Roll call vote: Burress no; Crist yes; Douglas yes; Eidenier yes; Hall yes; Meade yes; President Rossi yes: Motion carried with six yes and one no.

Adjourned at 9:05 P.M. to go into closed session to discuss purchase of property.

Returned to regular session at 9:25 P.M.

President Rossi adjourned the meeting until July 9<sup>th</sup> 2002 at 7:00 P.M. in the Wright-Waldron Municipal Building.
